WORDSMITH ON THE MOVE

MY VISIT TO CARDBOARD FACTORY

I visited a small-scale cardboard making factory in my Home – Town. My parents took all due permissions for the same from the authorities. Pulp is the raw material for cardboard making, which is nothing but soft substance obtained by grinding or pressing trees, plants or old paper/card boards etc.

I had many good experiences by seeing the process. At the factory, the pulp was soaked in water and mixed finely in a well-like structure. The pulp mix was poured with high pressure on a fast rotating cylindrical machine. It was an amazing sight to see!

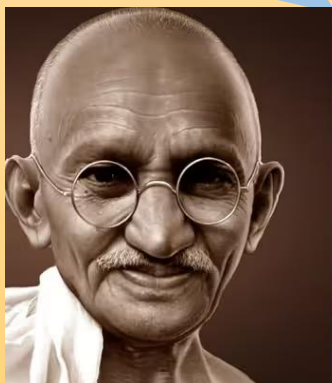
The pulp mix formed a thin layer around the cylinder. The pressure and rotating speed was deciding the thickness of the cardboard. I saw the workers, making a line on the thin layer after which they peeled the cardboard in an approximate square shape. The wet sheets were thereafter dried in the sunlight. Afterwards, it was pressed in a roller to remove the foldings and then it was cut in the required size and shape using the cutter!

I have vivid memories of my experience while visiting the factory. I learnt how much of hard work is put to give such fine, finished products. It was a memorable experience, I will always cherish.

What is my Child hiding from me?

The adorable clingy toddler, that we couldn't get enough of, has suddenly has become very distant why?

Why is my growing child suddenly becoming so rude?

Why is my child arguing with me so much?

Why does my child not share things with me? Is he/she hiding something from me?

Should I be scared?

Many parents feel this way, about their child growing up. They are almost paranoid about the safety of their child, and above all quite bewildered about the changes in attitude and behaviour, of their growing children.

As children grow up, their little world begins to expand rapidly. They, with their natural curiosity, attempt to explore and learn new things by touching it or interacting with it. This begins when the child is around 2 years old.

We, as parents who are anxious, and protective tend to hold back the child from many "interesting", and unknown things. Due to their natural curiosity, they will some how, many times manage to try new things, in spite of your careful watching. When they are caught doing potentially dangerous things, they get punished.

Contrary to popular opinion, punishment teaches the child to hide things from the parents, rather than scare them. Now the child understands, what it can safely share, and what it cannot, with the parent. Like this, often lying and hiding small things start.

As the child grows up, and comes into their teenage, the punishments at home tend to become more severe for the child. Often the punishments are not scolding or lecturing the child, but being given the silent treatment, being taunted or being compared and put down.

Hence, growing children refuse to share at home. We as parents and caretakers can change this, by changing the way we treat them and make them feel. Making your child feel sad, guilty or ashamed is not the right way to discipline them. Talk; have a conversation, and share, that you are scared for them, share that, you love them and, want them to be safe and happy.

When your child does share something, don't be in a hurry to correct them, or judge them. Listen; by listening you will realize that your child is actually very sensible and is acting out of common sense.

When correcting your child, don't jump into what is wrong first, appreciate their efforts and all the good things they have done. Then talk about why, what they did was wrong. Children understand well and quickly. They just need patience and lots of love.

Then, you will become their best friend!
